to visitors.

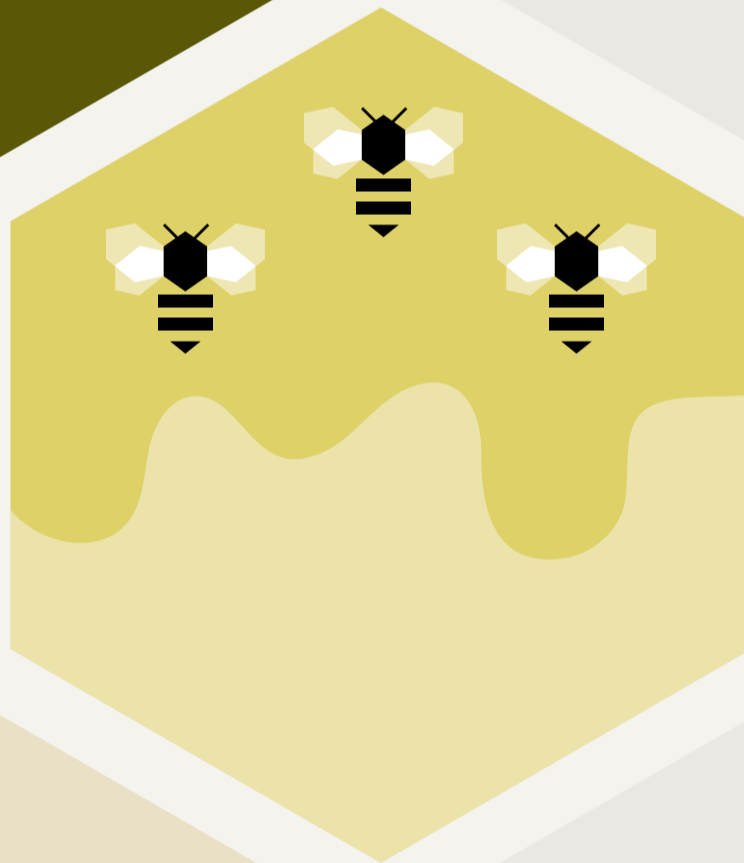


Guarantees of the bees

The Charity

The Friends of Gedling
Country Park was formed in
late 2014 to help develop
and maintain the new country
park, aiming to enhance its
habitats, flora and fauna
and to serve as an active
means of communication
and co-operation between
all users.

Gedling Solar Farm

- The Farm has 23,000 solar modules across the 14-hectare site.
- It is estimated that the farm generates enough electricity to power 1,000 local homes every year.
- The site is the former Gedling Colliery which has been unused since its closure in 1991.

About Gedling Solar Farm

The 6MW Gedling Solar Farm generates enough clean electricity to power 1,000 local homes. Situated on the old Gedling Colliery land, near Calverton, Nottinghamshire, Foresight Group, the solar farm's owner, has worked closely with the Friends of Gedling Country Park to ensure that the natural habitat is fully protected and constitutes 'sustainable development'. The project is close to a National Grid connection point and the site is used as an education resource for local schools. The solar farm has been energised from 2014 and has a life span of 25 years.
